

**QQ - Red and White Block Exchange**  
**Due: QQ Meeting February 9, 2012**

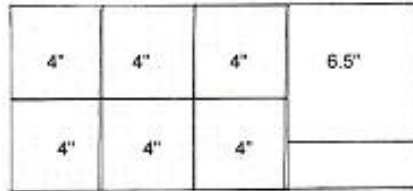
- Make: 1 for you + 3 more = 4  
 or 1 for you + 8 more = 9  
 or 1 for you + 11 more = 12

■ Do NOT sign the blocks

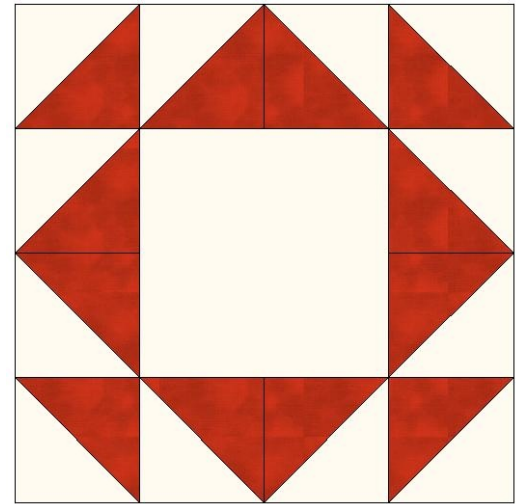
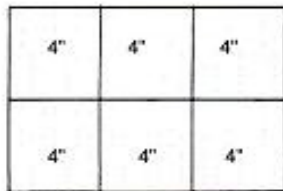
■ Use white thread and 1/4-inch seams

■ For **each** block: Tone on Tone fabric

**White:** 8" x 18½"  
 Cut six 4" squares  
 Cut one 6½" square



**Red:** 8" x 12"  
 Cut six 4" squares



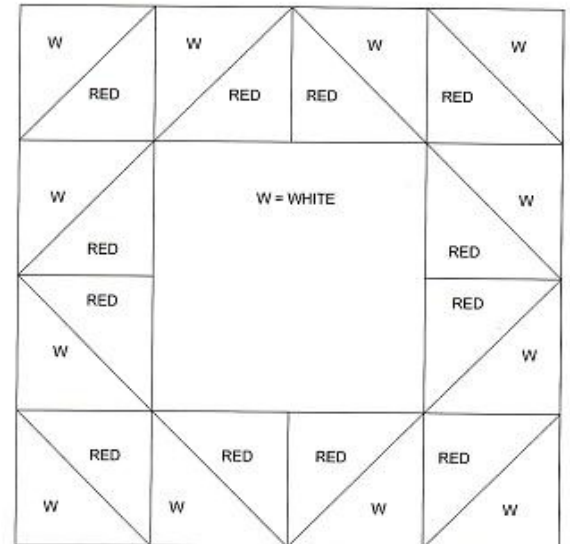

- Cut one 6½" square from white.

- Using 3" (finished) Thangles®, Triangles on a Roll, or the method below, make 12 red/white half-square triangle units (3½" unfinished - trim if necessary)

- Join four pairs of units so reds meet in center (red mountains), and sew one set to the top and one set to the bottom of the 6½" white square

- Join remaining half-square units to the other "mountains," being careful to align them per the diagram, and complete the block following the diagram.



- Finished block should measure 12½" including 1/4-inch seam allowances

**Making half-square triangle units:**

Cut 4" squares as directed above. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the white square. Join red and white squares, right sides together, and sew ¼" on both sides of the drawn line. (You can also draw the stitching lines if you prefer.) Cut apart on drawn diagonal line and press seams toward the red fabric. Trim each square, using the 45-degree line on a ruler, to 3½".
